Make a difference by being part of the second annual Secret Marathon 3K as we run, walk and work together towards equality. Everyone welcome!



lunch, networking, fundraising and inspiring keynote speakers.



Federal Election Issues

CFUW National invited Clubs to consider a list of key issues that we anticipate will appear on Party Platforms and debates during the upcoming Federal Election. The CFUW Victoria Advocacy Committee reviewed the issues and chose the 5 below, for which National will develop talking points. The goal is that members will be able to draw from this information when they meet candidates at their door, at town-halls and at All Candidates' Forums.

- 1. Women in Non-Traditional occupations & skilled trades this aligns with S&B and our proposed IWD 2020 event theme
- 2. Universal Childcare to include the need for supports for grandparents raising children
- 3. Poverty specifically child poverty and the educational needs of children
- 4. Housing and Homelessness addressing the root causes for youth homelessness
- 5. Universal Pharmacare supports for people living in poverty



Please join us in celebrating the innovative career of one of Victoria's most accomplished visual artists -- Pat Martin Bates. This fifty-year survey exhibition takes a specific look at the experimental approaches the artist has explored and is being presented as a special project in honour of the Council's 50th anniversary year from 1-30 March.

At 91 years old and with over half a century of artistic output, Pat Martin Bates has been widely recognized and praised within Canada, winning awards and honours such as her RCA and FRSC designations, her Queen's Jubilee Medal, an honorary degree, and exhibitions throughout the country. Still, her achievements have been even more deeply appreciated overseas. She has exhibited throughout the world over many decades, and has been honoured with awards ranging from the Global Graphics Award in Holland in 1993 (the only Canadian to achieve this honour) to the Gold Medal at the International Biennale of Prints, Norway to the Critics' Choice Award at the Print Biennial in Ljubljana, Yugoslavia in 1977. Affectionately regarded everywhere as PMB, she is known in England as Lady Print, in Japan as Ambassador Extraordinaire, and in Yugoslavia, The Angel from Heaven. She is esteemed universally as the doyenne and spirit of Canadian printmaking.

Gwyn (nee Mair Ogwen Rees) was born in Brynmenyn, South Wales, and graduated from Charlotte Mason College in the English Lake District and York University in Canada. When diagnosed with MS she moved to Victoria where she spent many happy years travelling and enjoying music, book-clubs, and bridge with cherished friends. Gwyn was predeceased by her brothers Gwilym (Anne) and Dillwyn Rees. She is survived by her children Susan (Bob), Nigel (Liz) and David (Sheila) and her grandchildren Patrick, Bryan and Katherine. She is fondly remembered by her lifelong friend Chris. Her family wishes to thank Dr. Rosenberg and his thoughtful staff and Helping Hands for their dedicated attention.
