Our Right to Vote: And How It Came To Be



The Federal election is on October 21st, and people across the country are trying to decide how to spend their single, precious ballot.

It was only 102 years ago that women in British Columbia finally joined the ranks of electors after a campaign that spanned continents and generations. The story of women's struggle for suffrage features a cast of educated, motivated, charismatic characters, whose individual persistence and bravery intertwined with contemporary political and social movements, like prohibition and the First World War, to catalyze the legislation that finally brought them the right to vote.

October is Women's History Month in Canada, a time to celebrate the achievements and contributions of women and girls across the country and throughout history.

The 2019 theme is **#MakeAnImpact**, in honour of the women and girls who have made a lasting impact as pioneers in their field. Whether they are business leaders, politicians, researchers, artists or activists, these women have helped shape Canada into a thriving, diverse and prosperous country through their achievements and desire to make a difference. <u>Women of Impact in Canada</u>, an online gallery that celebrates the achievements of more than 100 women and girls through photos and biographies that capture some of their many successes.

Two additional important days take place in October this year. October 11 is <u>International</u> <u>Day of the Girl</u>, a UN international observance dedicated to championing girls' rights around the world. As well, October 18 is <u>Persons Day</u>, which, this year, marks 90 years since the historic decision to include women in the legal definition of "persons" was handed down by Canada's highest court of appeal.

Help Us Find a New Meeting Location!

The Citadel is choosing to go in another direction and our space will no longer be available to rent for our general meetings.

Our Programs Committee jumped into action and toured several facilities before choosing the Windsor Pavilion. This facility has been booked for our meetings in January – April of next year. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Rachel McDonnell and Sue Whitesides for all of their efforts in evaluating the various meeting spaces so quickly to find a suitable location for our meetings!

The Citadel has been a fairly central location for our membership. I recently learned that there are some members who are concerned about the new location and don't find it to be quite as convenient as the Citadel. A great suggestion was made (thanks Paddy!) to form a committee with one member from each neighbourhood group to review and discuss potential options for meeting spaces in Greater Victoria beginning with our opening night in September, 2020. Whether we eventually have one central location again (like the Citadel), or we rotate between a handful of locations around the City, it will be useful for the club to have several viable suggestions that meet the necessary criteria for our general meetings (set up/take down, adequate space, parking, access, audio-visual, etc...). A list of suggested meeting spaces that meet the necessary criteria can then be provided to our Programs Committee for planning for the upcoming year (2020-21).

We want our members to be able to gather together monthly so it is important that we have a meeting space that is convenient for many. CFUW Victoria's Sue Whitesides honoured

CIPS Congratulates Dr. Sue Whitesides on becoming a CIPS Fellow



Dr. Sue Whitesides, FCIPS has been awarded the distinction of CIPS (Canadian Information Processing Society) 'Fellow' by the Society. 'Fellow' is the highest honour given to leaders within the IT community in Canada for outstanding contributions to the industry and CIPS.

Sue is known nationally and internationally as an educator and researcher. She served as the first woman Director, McGill School of Computer Science, and then as the first woman Chair, Dept of Computer Science, University of Victoria, retiring in December 2016. She continues to mentor grad students.

A Stanford graduate in Electrical Engineering, and a PhD in Mathematics, University of Wisconsin, Sue has created a network of colleagues around the world, advancing the design of algorithms for solving problems modelled by geometry and graphs. At UVic she led collaborations with MITACS, the Canadian organization that partners industry and government practitioners with university students and researchers, to advance research and foster innovation in Canada's IT industry. She served a 5-year term on the Association of Computing Machinery's Award Committee, selecting the winner of the annual ACM Prize in Computing, a mid-career award of \$250,000, second only to the ACM Turing Award, "Nobel Prize" of computer science.
