Charity for our Holiday Luncheon: Boys & Girls Club

Below are details on the specific program that we will be supporting:

#### The Youth Prenatal & Parenting Program (YP3)

The Youth Prenatal & Parenting Program (YP3) helps young women who are pregnant or in the early months of parenting (aged 13-24) youth by facilitating independent living in a Care Family home, for up to one year, and promotes positive parenting strategies through one-on-one and group counselling. Each youth is paired with a Youth and Family Counsellor who will support them to develop life skills, access community resources, increase knowledge of infant care, and encourage healthy relationships. Through supported independent living in a stable and caring environment, the young moms can acquire the skills needed to reach their potential as independent women and skilled parents.

# Members can contribute to this program in two ways at our Christmas Luncheon:

- 1. By making a donation at the luncheon (cash or cheque) there will be envelopes on each table; and/or
- 2. Suggested by the YP3 program: something for the young moms would be a nice donation in-kind. Suggestions include: personal care items and/or experiences such as movie vouchers, coffee cards (Tim Hortons, Starbucks)

### Membership Dues for 2020/21

As we discussed at our recent meeting, and at our AGM this past spring, CFUW Victoria is having to increase our membership dues next year. CFUW National dues have increased to \$76 per member, and BC Council dues will be increasing to \$3 per member this year. Our Club is also making some exciting changes with the introduction of Wild Apricot (our new membership management software) and moving to a new meeting venue in the new year. All of these changes have contributed to a rising cost structure. Consequently, our Executive Committee is recommending that we increase membership dues to \$125 per year. The last dues increase for CFUW Victoria was in 2012.

CFUW Victoria members will be asked to ratify \$15 dues increase for 2020/21 to \$125 per year at the January meeting. Please join us for our General Meeting on January 15 at our new meeting venue, Windsor Pavilion in Oak Bay.



# **Member Spotlight**

YAM Magazine features CFUW Victoria member Pat Martin Bates



Artist Pat Martin Bates' Family Heirloom Creates a Connection Through Time Yam Magazine, September/October

Beside her bed, Pat Martin Bates keeps a porcelain figurine of two little blonde boys in green shorts, flanked by two lambs standing over a pond. The boys remind the artist of her father, Chester, and his cousin, Ronald, both of whom died tragically young.

Over the years, Pat has turned the figurine into a shrine of sorts, filling its pond ("it's a magic pond") with seashells and pearls ("we all love pearls"), a thimble-sized swaddled baby doll ("that's me), and the figures of two dogs, one a terrier who belonged to her family and died in the Tidal Bore in the Bay of Fundy in New Brunswick, where Pat grew up and discovered the talents which would lead her to become one of Canada's most revered artists.

Pat Martin Bates (or PMB as she's known) says the figurine evokes joy and melancholy, reminding her of her doting father who died when Pat was eight. There are many stories about him in her book, *It is I, Patricia: An Artist's Childhood* (Hedgerow Press, 2010).

Her father, she says, once kept the figurine by his bed and put his watch in it. Later, Pat kept her own Lady Hamilton watch in it, a connection through time.

And PMB knows about time. Timepieces and the movement of the sun and moon are recurring themes in her work, which has been exhibited worldwide and acclaimed for its ability to transcend the ordinary.

Critic Richard Simmins once wrote, "Bates lives in a strange world. She intensifies experience ..." And so a simple figurine is not so simple. It holds a magical world that she tends as she continues to create because, as she says, "An artist never retires."
