

## Lisa Gordon If urban trees could speak about climate change



Lisa Gordon's life is dedicated to protecting trees. Her Masters degree in Environmental Studies focused on the politics of saving South Moresby (now known as Gwaii Haanas). Her career was with environmental and governmental organizations, most recently with the Islands Trust. In her retirement, she joined Community Trees Matter to speak for the trees in our urban environment. She also offers "Courage Earth" workshops for people who sometimes feel overwhelmed by all the bad news.

Lisa will provide an overview of the relationship between trees and climate change, explain why urban trees matter so much and offer ways to support urban trees. She will draw on her own experience and lessons from the works of Peter Wohlleben, Robin Wall Kimmerer and other popular writers about trees.

#### Membership Dues for 2020/21

CFUW Victoria provides members with opportunities to expand their network, discover new interests and activities, and take action by promoting women's rights and education.

As we discussed at the AGM last spring, and at our meeting in November, CFUW Victoria will be increasing our membership dues next year. CFUW National dues have increased to \$76 per member, and BC Council dues will be increasing to \$3 per member this year. Our Club is also making some exciting changes with the introduction of Wild Apricot (our new membership management software) that will enhance our members' ability to connect with our club (events, registration, and improved communication through our updated website). CFUW Victoria will be moving to a new meeting venue for our general meetings starting in January. All of these changes

have contributed to a rising cost structure. Consequently, our Executive Committee has recommended that membership dues increase to \$125 per year for full membership. This is the first increase in membership dues since 2012.

CFUW Victoria members will be asked to ratify a \$15 dues increase for 2020/21 at the January meeting. Please join us for our general meeting on January 15 at our new meeting venue, the Windsor Pavilion in Oak Bay.
