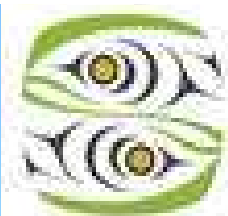

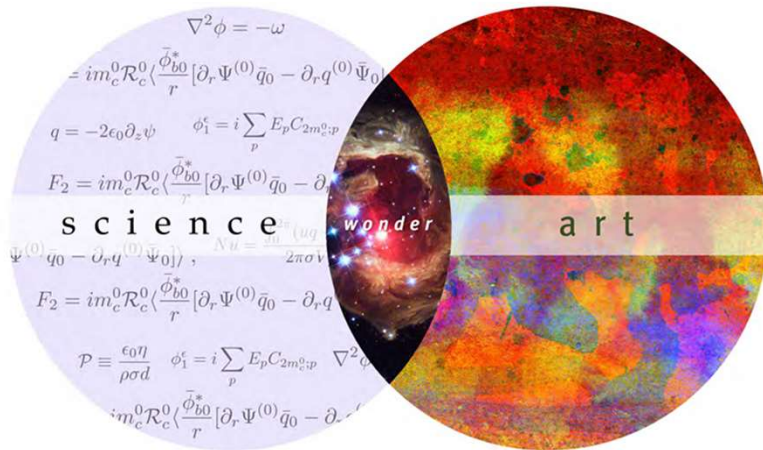

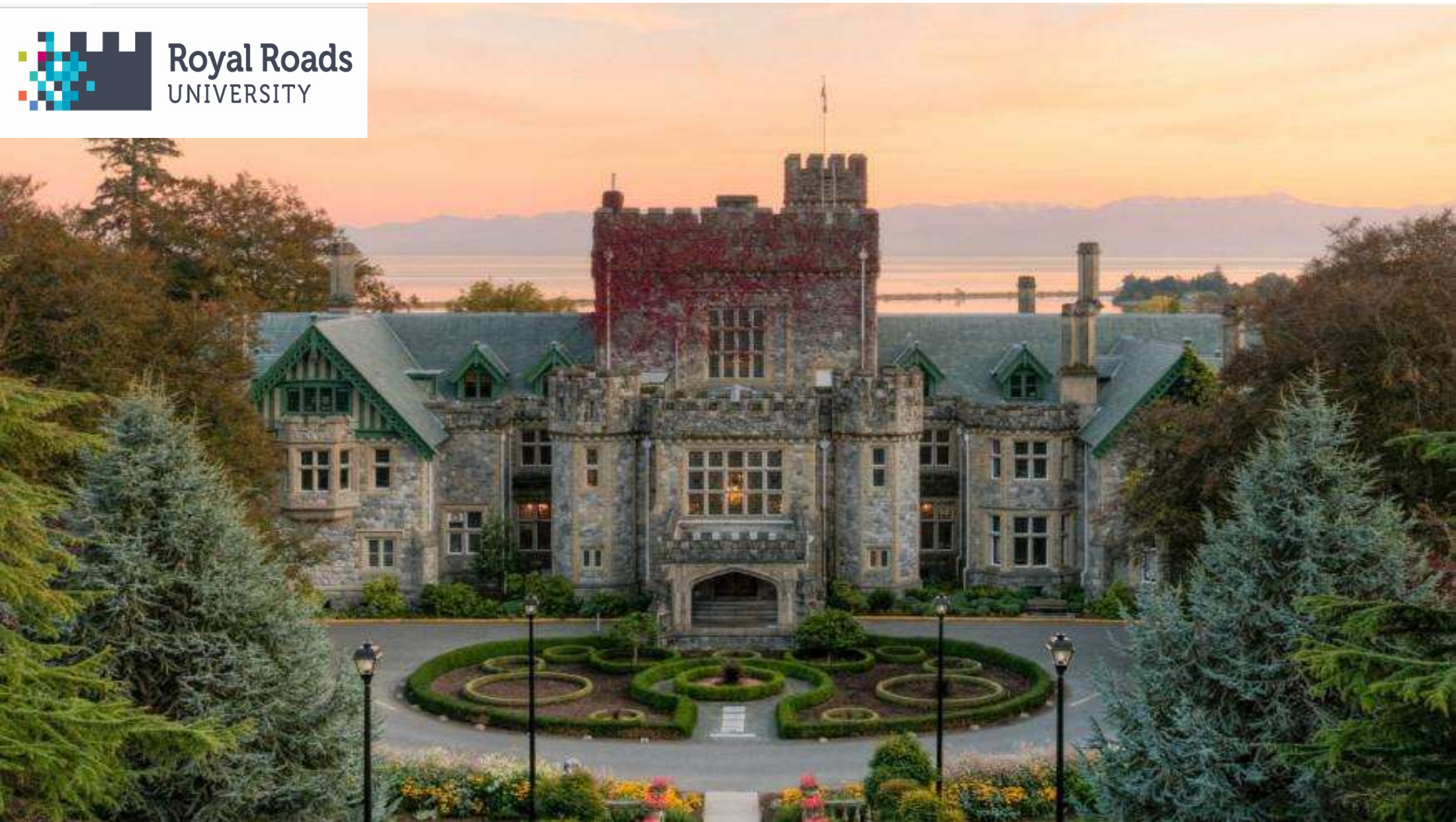
Awarded to a student in good standing in the Indigenous Health Care Assistant program. Preference to women students.

- Currently completing research on male victims & survivors of child sexual abuse and human trafficking for sexual exploitation



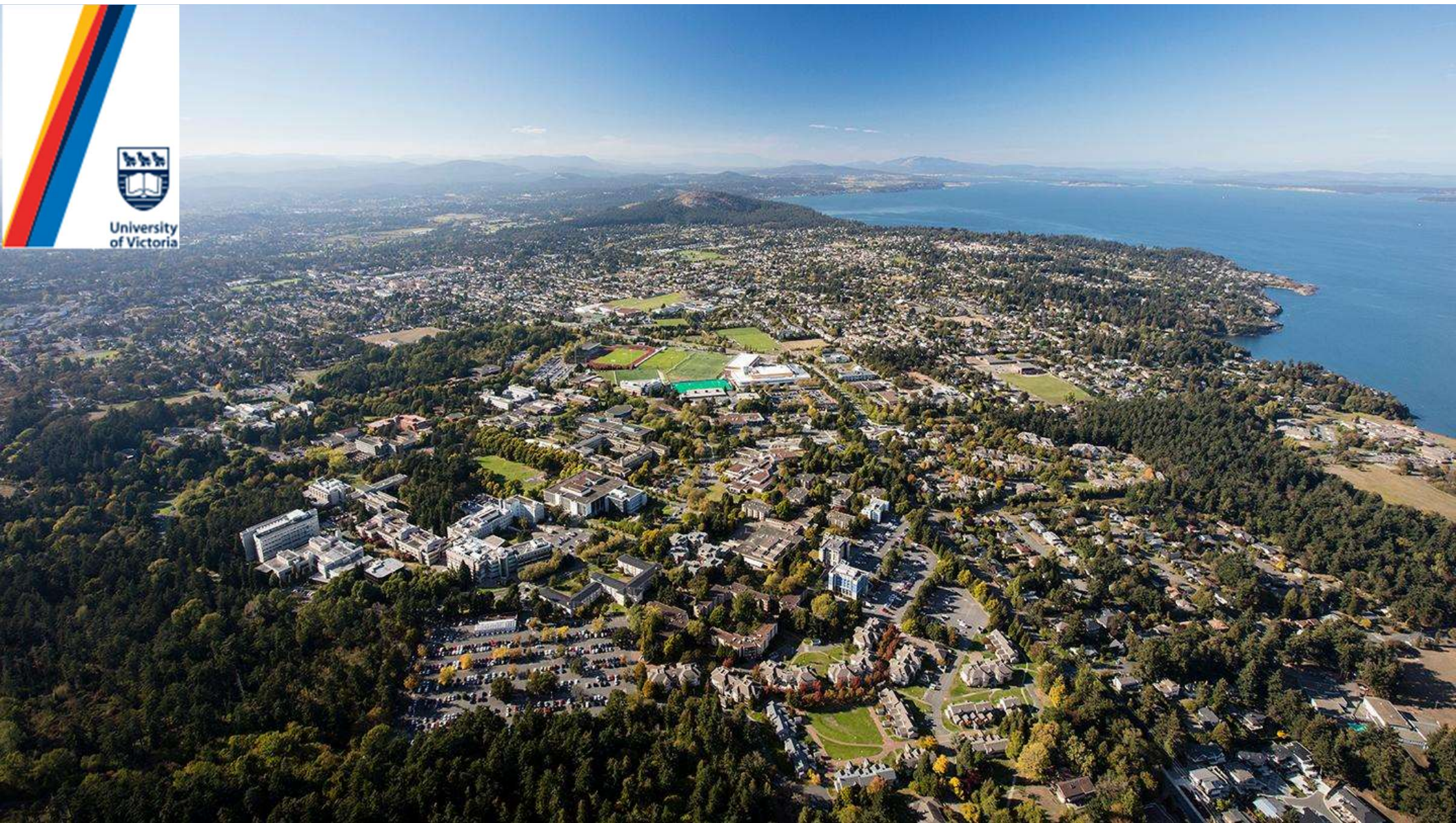

- is a Director on The Military Museums Foundation board



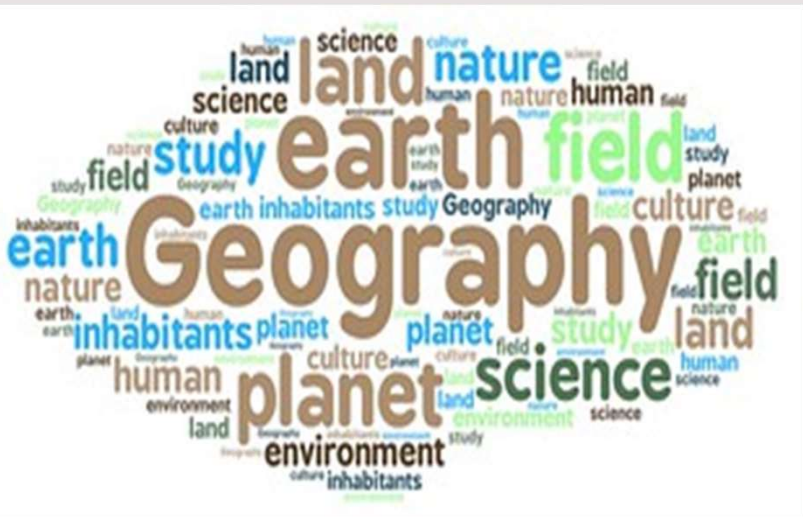
